PLACEMENT INFORMATION

Job Description:

This position is scheduled and reports to the executive chef. Food Prep and Breading primarily includes prepping food, breading seafood but employees are expected to keep their work area clean and organized. Training is provided.

Each week, employees will have 5 food prep/breading shifts and 1 bussing shift. If someone prefers to work all shifts in the kitchen, that is fine but you cannot choose to just be a bus person as the shifts in the kitchen are required.

Prep & Breading: 1st shift is typically 9AM - 4PM 2nd shift is typically 4PM - 9PM (possibly 9:30 depending on when the kitchen closes)
Bussing: 1st shift is 10AM - 4PM 2nd shift is 4PM - 9:30/10PM

The hours don't need to change but there may be more hours available if the employee chooses to work overtime. Also, if there is an opportunity to try a new role, the employee may choose to do that.

Transportation for Community Housing Description:

The Cape can be very dangerous in the summer. Traffic can be very heavy, tourists can be unfamiliar with the roads, lighting on the roads can be very poor, and there are often no dedicated bicycle lanes. A few tips will help you to keep safe on the road: Ensure your bicycle can run safely. It is a state law to place a red blinking light on the back of your bicycle. This light is absolutely essential to your safety biking at night. A bright white light on the front of your bike will help light the way and prevent you coming across any dangerous obstacles. Bright clothing (preferably a neon vest) at night will increase visibility greatly. Ride on the right (not the left) side of the road to ensure you move in the same direction as traffic.

The Cape Cod RTA also offers DART (Dial-A-Ride Transportation) and SmartDART services. DART operates by appointment, while SmartDART is available on-demand and offers cost-effective transportation solution.

Cape Cod has many car-free options for getting to and around the region, and traveling by bus is one of our most popular choices! Both Peter Pan Bus Line and Plymouth & Brockton Bus offer services from Boston to Woods Hole and Hyannis, where you can connect with in-town buses, ferry providers, livery service and auto rentals. Only Peter Pan provides service between Hyannis and Providence, RI.

After the participant arrives in the US and registers with SEVIS they will need to wait at least 48 hours and then go to the Social Security Office in Hyannis located at 100 Independence Dr, Hyannis, MA 0260. This office is open Monday through Friday so participants should take that into account when scheduling arrival dates.

Grooming Requirements:

Employees must appear clean shaven and any prior existing facial hair must be neatly trimmed and well groomed. Hair must be clean & neatly styled for a professional environment. Light perfume/cologne only. Extreme hair colors are not permitted. Visible tattoos must be minimal, non-offensive, not visible on hands, neck or head. Piercings: one earring in each ear, no oversize or gauge earrings permitted. Other piercings on the body must not be visible; including tongue, lip & eyebrow rings.

Applicable Company Policies:

Employees are expected to arrive on time for work and ready to work with a smile and a positive attitude. Long hair must be tied back before entering the restaurant. Participants should speak English at all times when communicating with customers and coworkers. Once clocked in, cell phones should be put away and not be visible during the shift (i.e. cannot be in your back pocket). Smoking or vaping is not permitted at the worksite. Any schedule changes/requests should be made 2 weeks in advance and approved by the manager. If last minute changes need to be made, employees are expected to find their own coverage. When possible, a set schedule can be accommodated so that participants can find a second job but are subject to the needs of this job first.

Baxter's is very much a team environment. We do our best to be a drama-free workplace. Employees are expected to stay busy at all times and clean or stock or help other employees if there are slower periods of time. Examples will be presented during training.
