

Boothbay Harbor Yacht Club - Sailing Instructor

HOST INFORMATION

Company Description:

The Boothbay Harbor Yacht Club (BHYC) was incorporated in 1895 by an act of the Maine Legislature following formative years dating back to 1870. The club soon became a sailing and social hub for the active summer colony and visiting yachtsmen.

During the 1920s the BHYC sponsored major speedboat races, filmed by Fox Films, and in early 1930s interest in sailing races rekindled. This led to the 1938 adoption and copyright of a 21 ft. class sailboat, the "Boothbay Harbor Yacht Club One Design", designed by naval architect Geerd Hendel. Many of the original wooden boats are still racing today.

The Junior Sailing Program, established in 1954, started teaching youngsters in Turnabouts. Members' children along with youth from the community currently learn and develop their sailing skills in Optimists and 420s.

A new clubhouse with dining room opened in 1968. In 2001, the club completed a major renovation to the clubhouse, resulting in an attractive and well-appointed setting for excellent dining and socializing for the club's members and their guests. An extensive dock area, with dinghy tie-ups and launch service, affords choice waterfront access to a large mooring field for members and visiting yachtsmen.

The social events throughout the summer, from weekly Thursday night cocktail parties to planned themed dining events, bring the membership together. Racing, cruising, social events and tennis programs are well supported by active and enthusiastic members of the Club.

Job Description:

The Junior Sailing Program Instructor position is responsible for ensuring that all apprentices positively represent the Club by creating a welcoming, professional environment for junior sailors, Club members, and parents and guests of junior sailors.

The Instructor is responsible for the day to day instruction of all Junior sailors, including its morning instruction and afternoon race programs. This position is also responsible for following and enforcing all Club and Junior Program policies including but not limited to equipment care, safety and conduct. Experience preferred.

Period of Performance

• June -August; Weekdays from 0830 to 1700.

- Prior to June and after August, part-time with duties as assigned.
- Additional hours may be required when the Club's junior sailors participate in regattas (at home and away).

Duties and Expectations

Include, but are not limited to:

- Coordinate and administer program's instructional and racing curriculum, including following US Sailing curriculum or such similar curriculum as is developed in cooperation with the Junior Sailing Committee.
- Implement the day-to-day instruction lesson plans and race team plans provided by the Director
- 1) Sailing experience in small boats, such as prams, dinghies, multi-hulls and small keelboats.
- 2) Experience operating a safety boat.
- 3) Previous participation in youth sailing program preferred, either as a student or instructor.
- Reinforce a system and culture of rewarding positive behaviors in the junior sailors and Apprentices, including sportsmanship, seamanship, and safety.
- Assist in organizing all regatta logistics including communication with racers and parents.
- Enforce all safety protocols.
- Ensure program participants follow the Club's Junior Program Staff Standards/Code of Conduct.
- Supervise the Junior Sailing Program's apprentices to ensure high-quality sailing and racing instruction, and that all students are supervised and participating in a safe and professional environment.
- Mentor sailing apprentices and students to help them improve knowledge and skills.
- Provide high-quality sailing and racing instruction.
- Ensure that the program, boats, and instructors are properly secured and equipment stowed at the end of each day.
- Report to the Director daily as outlined by the Director regarding condition of boats, any parts that are needed, damage that has occurred, and ensure all equipment is accounted for.
- Maintain required certifications
