Company Description:

We operated two restaurants, one for lunch and one for dinner. In the past students have worked at one restaurant for lunch, then a second shift at the restaurant for dinner. This means students can work as many as 5-6 days a week and 45 to 55 hours a week. It also provides a variety of work and makes for a more interesting work schedule. Our lunch time restaurant is called Larson's Lunch Box. It is a small shack that sells burgers, hot dogs, lobster rolls and other quick and simple food. It is fast paced and has only 3 or 4 people working at any time. There are many shared tasks like sweeping and mopping, stocking and setting up and closing down the restaurant. Our dinner restaurant is a more formal sit-down traditional restaurant that has over a 100 seats on two floors. As many as 15 people are working at any time between the kitchen and the dining room.

The work environment is fast paced, but fun with everyone working together toward the same goals. The town of Damariscotta is a classic Maine small town, located at the head of the Damariscotta River which leads out to the ocean. There are dozens of activities in the area from boating to swimming to hiking, museums, shopping, theater and so on. A few beaches are near by both river and lakes and the ocean.

Students on the Cultural exchange work in several restaurants in the area and both Tim and Tamara have several years of experience hosting students.
