There is free public buses & trolley that run through most of Mammoth Lakes. Be sure to check bus schedule before securing housing to ensure a bus stop is close to your housing.

ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Arrival Instructions:

*There are a few options for arrival into Mammoth Lakes. **We highly suggest flying into Reno, NV!** From the airport in Reno, you can take the Eastern Sierra Transit Authority bus directly into Mammoth Lakes. It's about a 3 hour drive.*

If you need to apply for a Social Security number, office in Reno is very close to the airport, and is the most understanding of the J1 arrival process.

If you do not need to apply for Social Security number, you can fly into Bishop, CA. Airport code is BIH and United Airlines is the only airline that goes into Bishop. There is an Eastern Sierra bus that will bring you to Mammoth Lakes from the airport. It is about a 45 minute drive.

The final option is to fly into Los Angeles (LAX) or San Francisco (SFO). There are limited flights from SFO into BIH especially in the summer, or you can take the train to the town of Lancaster, and then take the Eastern Sierra Transit Authority bus to Mammoth Lakes from there. This is more expensive and takes more planning.

Travel from all other cities is not encouraged. Due to lack of any public transportation to Mammoth Lakes.

All J-1 who do not have a Social Security # MUST visit the Social Security office BEFORE you arrive in Mammoth Lakes. You can pre-apply before you visit the Social Security office to help your appointment move faster when in person. The link is in the j1 Info Hub. Reno is our preferred office, as we work closely with their staff to ensure that students can apply upon arrival to the US, rather than having to wait for SEVIS validation.

Grooming Requirements:

Employees are required to maintain clean, neat, and well-groomed hairstyles, which do not interfere with job duties. Hair that presents a health or safety hazard or is longer than the collar may be required to be pulled back ponytail, clip, hat, hairnet or other restraint in solid color, presenting a professional and neat appearance. Hair should not obstruct the eyes as to maintain eye contact and a clean line of sight. Radical hairstyles are not allowed.

Applicable Company Policies:

Tattoos must not present a distraction, be offensive, or violate the Company's antiharassment or discrimination policies. Large or offensive tattoos must be covered at all times. The Company reserves the right to restrict any visible tattoo that detracts from the Company's image and/or negatively reflects on the Employee's professionalism. Visible tattoos may not violate the Company's Anti-Harassment or Discrimination policies and may not, otherwise, be of a vulgar, offensive, or controversial nature. The Company reserves the right to require that an employee's detracting or negatively reflecting tattoo be covered or concealed while in the workplace. Facial tattoos are generally prohibited Jewelry should not be loose-hanging, distracting, or create any health or safety hazard. Jewelry must be professional in appearance and must not interfere with job function or safety. Rings, necklaces, and watches are permitted but should be removed when working around machinery. Employees may wear no more than two earrings per ear. Employees in safety sensitive positions may not wear earrings that hang from the ear (i.e., studs only). Earrings must not exceed the size of a dime. Ear "tunnels" that are larger than a dime must be filled with a skin colored plug while at work. One small, tasteful, and unobtrusive nose stud (not a ring, barbell, or other design) is allowed. Concealing facial jewelry or other visible body piercing with a bandage is not acceptable. Facial Hair should be clean and well-kept. Neatly trimmed mustaches, beards, sideburns, soul patches, and goatees are allowed but must be well-groomed. It is not

permissible to merely not shave, rather, facial hair must be neatly trimmed and maintained, including where applicable, clearly groomed neck and cheek lines. If you did not shave or groom daily, you are not in compliance with this policy. Radical facial hair is not allowed (e.g., braided and pony-tailed beards, etc.). "New growth" facial hair must be neatly trimmed or maintained.

Mammoth Resorts is a Smoke-Free Workplace. Smoking/vaping is prohibited within 50 feet of an entrance, exit, or operable window of all buildings. Employees are not permitted to smoke or chew tobacco while in their uniform. Employees are not permitted to chew on toothpicks or gum while on duty.
