All of our housing arrangements are located in the same area and are pre-assigned to students prior to their arrival. The cost of housing arrangements is \$1,700 per student for the entire program duration. We offer payments to be broken into a weekly rate of \$125 per week if payment cannot be made in full at beginning of the program. Payment starts from the first week of arrival and the total of \$1,700 must be paid off by August 11th. In addition, all students are required to pay \$300 security deposit the first day after arrival, and is refundable only after inspection that there is no damage, and all is clean. Each house includes utilities, internet, refrigerator, washer, dryer, microwave, oven, stove, kitchen supplies and utensils, air conditioning, and is furnished. Bedding, linen, and pillows will be extra charge if students don't bring it with them or purchase on their own. Rooms are guaranteed to not be co-ed, but housing may be co-ed. Arrival Instructions:

There are two ways to get to Chincoteague, VA:

1) Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD) - About 3 and 1/2 Hours Away Nonstop from Chincoteague, VA

We recommend for students who fly into IAD to use the bus or train to get to Oak Hall, VA, which is only 10 minutes away from Chincoteague, VA. To do so, students can first take the bus, taxi, or Uber to Union Station in Washington, DC, which is about 40 minutes away from IAD. Virginia Breeze is one bus line that transports from IAD to Union Station for tickets starting at \$15 per ticket (https://virginiabreeze.org/). Then, Greyhound is one bus line that transports from Union Station to Oak Hall for tickets starting at \$63 (https://www.greyhound.com/). Once you reach to T's Corner Exxon in Oak Hall, VA, employer will arrange to pick up student from bus station, but employer must have prior notice. Students must also send a copy of bus and plane ticket as soon they are booked to employer. We strongly advise students book their bus ticket at least a week prior to departure since tickets tend to sell out fast, and you may not find one on the same day as your arrival if left until the day of. We prefer arrival be between Sunday to Wednesday, however, it is no issue if

the only arrival date is on a weekend. In addition, there is no set date or time that students must arrival at, as long as the ticket information is sent to employer in advance to coordinate pick up for the student. 2) John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK) - About 5 Hours Away Nonstop from Chincoteague, VA

We recommend for students who fly into JFK to use the bus or train to get to Oak Hall, VA, which is only 10 minutes away from Chincoteague, VA. To do so, students can first take the bus, taxi, or Uber to Port Authority in New York, which is about 40 minutes away from JFK. The JFK Airtrain is one shuttle service that transports from JFK to Port Authority for tickets starting at \$5 per ticket (https://www.jfkairport.com/to-from-airport/air-train). Students can take the JFK Airtrain to the Manhattan bound E train which will take you to 42nd street Port Authority bus terminal, or they can take the AirTrain at JFK and then transfer to the MTA subway for an additional \$2.75. You can take either the A or E train -- both stop at Port Authority. Then, Greyhound is one bus line that transports from Port Authority to Oak Hall for tickets starting at \$40 (https://www.greyhound.com/). Once you reach to T's Corner Exxon in Oak Hall, VA, employer will arrange to pick up student from bus station, but employer must have prior notice. Students must also send a copy of bus and plane ticket as soon they are booked to employer. We strongly advise students book their bus ticket at least a week prior to departure since tickets tend to sell out fast, and you may not find one on the same day as your arrival if left until the day of. We prefer arrival be between Sunday to Wednesday, however, it is no issue if the only arrival date is on a weekend. Grooming Requirements:

We require all employees to display good hygiene at all times while working. While ear and small stud nose piercings are acceptable, lip, eye, and other facial piercings are not allowed at work. Septum and hoop nose piercings are also not allowed. Tattoos are acceptable, as long as there are no facial tattoos. Long hair must also be tied back while at work.

Applicable Company Policies:

We require all employees to display acceptable behavior at all times while working. Aside from always checking on the customers (if waitressing) and making sure all side work is completed before the end of the student's shift to be ready for the next shift, some policies include no cell phones in the dining room area in front of customers. If there are any important phone calls or emergencies, they can be taken in the back break room. In addition, meals are to be eaten before or after rush hours or when it is not busy. If student wants to eat at the restaurant before lunch time, they should arrive prior to their shift to have that taken care of beforehand. There is no smoking at housing or at work. Smoking is allowed outside at work, but employees MUST wash hands after smoking and before returning to work. Smoking break is also only allowed when it is not busy and all work is completed. In regard to scheduling, the schedule is completed every Saturday and posted either Saturday night or Sunday Morning. Each week schedule starts on Monday and ends on Sunday. We are very accommodating to people with second jobs, but any work conflict or requested time off must be submitted to the manager by Thursday night of that week or that time off is not guaranteed. Other company policies and job expectations will be described in further detail during training sessions.
