#### Training requirements:

Participants complete an orientation with the restaurant's General Manager to review policies, guidelines, procedures, and expectations. Participants then complete an all-modules training (including sanitation procedures, alcohol handling, etc.) with certified training manager and complete tests after each module. In the first two weeks, management conducts one-on-ones with participants to ensure they are

ready to move forward with serving more than 3 tables at a time.

The uniform is not company provided, but the participants do have the option to purchase their shoes through payroll deduction. ### Transportation for Community Housing Description:

Most common method of transportation for participants to and from the site of employment will be by rideshare services (Uber or Lyft) or by bike. Bikes can be purchased at the nearby Target (approximately one mile from the site of employment) or rented at Bike Zone of Cape Cod (Bike Rentals - Bike Zone of Cape Cod | MA (bikezonecapecod.com). Please note that not all local roads feature sidewalks.

## ARRIVAL INFORMATION

#### Arrival Instructions:

There are two options for your travel to Hyannis, Massachusetts. Employer suggests flying into Boston International Airport (BOS) which offers more flight options and is typically more affordable.

1) Boston Logan International Airport (BOS)

We recommend that participants fly into Boston International Airport and take a bus to Hyannis, Massachusetts (approximate travel time 2-2.5 hours). Participants can use the Peter Pan Bus line that connects to the Hyannis Transportation Center. Bus tickets are \$30.00-\$40.00 (https://peterpanbus.com/routes/boston-to-hyannis-bus/). Participants can arrange transportation from the Hyannis Transportation Center via Uber or Lyft rideshare services (\$8-\$20, prices can get more expensive later in the day). Participants must have the Uber or Lyft apps downloaded on their phone in order to use the service, nonetheless, this service is strongly recommended in this area due to the frequency of cars. 2) Cape Cod Gateway Airport (HYA)

Participants also have the option to fly into Cape Cod Gateway Airport (HYA) which is located less than two miles from the place of employment. Participants can arrange transportation from the airport via Uber or Lyft rideshare services (\$8-\$20, prices can get more expensive later in the day). Participants must have the Uber or Lyft apps downloaded on their phone in order to use the service, nonetheless, this service is strongly recommended in this area due to the frequency of cars. ## TRAINING AND ONBOARDING

Grooming Requirements:

Students should be neat, clean and presentable for the work environment. Hair must be clean and styled. Long hair (below the shoulder) must be restrained. Personal cleanliness is very important. Maintain good hygiene, preventing unpleasant breath and body odor. Clothing should be clean, pressed and properly fitted.
