ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Arrival Instructions:

Your work agreement has a start date and an end date. You are expected to work until the last day of your work agreement, the end date. Please plan your travel period and return to university accordingly. Students should plan to arrive to the USA a couple days prior to start of work so they can register in SEVIS and apply for their Social Security Number.

Students should arrive to Boston Logan Airport, and take the P&B bus to Hyannis. http://www.p-b.com/. The bus picks you up at the lower level in front of baggage claim at the airport. It is a 3 hour bus ride that drops you off at the Hyannis Transportation Center or Park & Ride Lot, Rte 6 & 132, Barnstable. From Hyannis, take the RTA bus line (https://capecodrta.org) or taxi or uber to your prearranged housing. You must inform your manager 2 weeks prior about your arrival plans before leaving your home country. Town Taxi of Cape Cod (508) 775-5555 or use an app for Uber or follow the bus schedule.

Asking for a lot of time off during the business months will not be granted. Of course we want our students to enjoy themselves and to site see and explore our country, but also needs to remember that you are here to help us during this very busy season.

Student receive a 20% discount on Tuesdays and Wednesday on everything in the store. There is a movie theater, Subway, Dunkin Donuts, Stop and Shop, etc... for students to get second jobs. Students MUST work through Labor Day. Students should be prepared that the employer will set up a video call once students have been hired to review job expectations.
